

In **2006/07** people enrolled with a Turanganui Primary Health Organisation general practice took advantage of services provided by **20** GPs and **28** nurses.

3000 people used Turanga Health services provided by **150** staff including **7** nurses and **65** caregivers.

624 enrolled people used the free Diabetes Get Checked programme, up from **565** the previous year.

61 new Maori clients enrolled in the Turanga Health smoking cessation programme.

\$229,350 was spent improving enrolment in the school dental service and on oral health promotion. Since October 2005 **114** patients

in the end stage of terminal disease received extended care from a GP.

700 patients had a free sexual health consult with a GP or practice nurse. **6** percent of users were male.

303 free minor surgeries on skin lesions were carried out and paid for by the PHO.

75 families took part in Sport Gisborne Tairawhiti's Healthy Kids Active Families programme.

4 Whanau Hauora Days were held to promote drug free lifestyles for the

1319 people who registered their attendance.

What is Turanganui Primary Health Organisation and what does it do?

Turanganui Primary Health Organisation or Turanganui PHO channels money into the six Gisborne general practices and one Maori health organisation that are part of it.

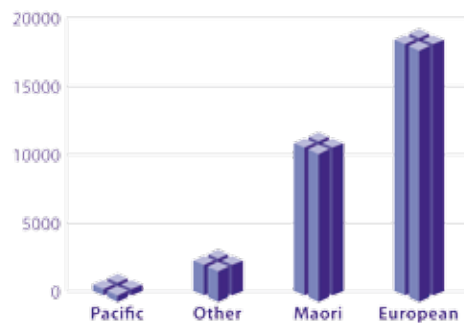
Each of the general practices, and Turanga Health provide a range of care. As well as seeing people when they are sick, the health professionals in the PHO also work to keep patients well by offering general and specific health checks and services, many of which are free.

Who is part of Turanganui PHO?

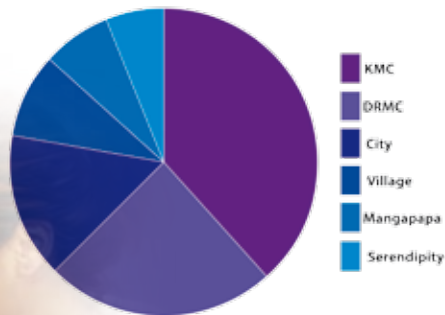

Our total income for the year was

\$5,692,856.00.

\$4,226,990.00 was used to reduce the cost of visits to the doctor, **\$533,724.00**

for Services to Improve Access projects, **\$70,333.00** for health promotion.

There was **\$656,144.00** in additional DHB funding for other agreements like diabetes and performance management programmes, and **\$296,665.00** for the management of the PHO.

Turanganui PHO and its associated health providers are changing the way they reduce the incidence and impact of some chronic health conditions.

Called HealthRight, this new way of working assists people to become more responsible for their own health. It starts at a patient's general practice.

The programme will take five years to fully implement and will involve all Turanganui PHO general practices and Turanga Health staff, as well as new HealthRight staff. There is the potential for hundreds of other people working in primary health in Tairāwhiti to also be involved.

In the first wave of implementation Kaiti Medical Centre, Serendipity Health Ltd, and The Village Clinic are trialling two HealthRight programmes: Chance Check and Lifetime Lifestyle. Both programmes relate to diabetes and cardiovascular disease risk assessment and case management.
